## <u>German</u>

Alle Leute lieben Samstag Abend, zwo, drei, vier (2x), Alle Leute, alle Leute .... Alle Leute lieben Samstag Abend. (2 is normally zwei ["tsvye" rhyming with bye bye], zwo ["tsvoh"] is Berlin dialect and sounds more emphatic)

## <u>French</u>

Tout le monde aime Samedi soir, deux, trois, quatre (2x), Tout le monde, tout le monde ... Tout le monde aime Samedi soir.

## <u>Spanish</u>

El Sabado ama todo el mundo, dos, tres, quatro (2x) Todo el mundo, todo el mundo .... El Sabado ama todo el mundo.

### <u>Japanese</u>

Minasama doyobi skimas', ni, san, shi (2x), Minasama, minasama .... Minasama doyobi skimas'.

Space for other languages - tell your friends who speak them that the line has to fit the rhythm of the melody, meaning they might have to get creative.

Note: This song originated in Ghana in the 1950s. A military government had imposed a curfew. On Saturdays, people defiantly filled the streets and sang this song to show they would not be intimidated. As the song became popular and circled the globe, the political background was nearly forgotten.
